Anchorages, ship-yards, docks, arsenals, and other establishments intended by the Government for the exclusive use of the navy, are the property of the State. First and second class harbors of general interest are national property and for public use. Art. 5. Everything cast upon the shore by the sea and which has no known owner belongs to the State. The treasury department, after the proper inventory and appraisal, shall seize it, and shall be liable for the claims of a third person and for the payment of charges and rewards for the finding and salvage thereof, in accordance with the prescriptions of laws and regulations. Art. 6. The Government, without prejudice to the obligations and rights of the owners and consignees, shall provide for the salvage of wrecked vessels, their cargoes and effects, and also for their recovery from the wreck in case of a total loss, in accordance with the provisions of maritime ordinances and regulations. Consular agents shall exercise...
